

# Scholarships, how do I find them?

## **Strategy One: Careers Expo**

Ask the representative at the Careers Expo Friday 26<sup>th</sup> July

## **Strategy Two: Using the University Website**

Simply go to the website of the University that you are looking to attend. Find the link to Scholarships and investigate the ones that may be relevant.

It may be a bit onerous but can be worthwhile

## **Strategy Three: Industry Associations**

Many industry associations (for example Nursing, see RNCA) have scholarships available for undergraduate students. Some of these scholarships are very generous.

## **Strategy Four: Using a Scholarship Search Engine**

I use "my future". Go to the myfuture website ([www.myfuture.edu.au](http://www.myfuture.edu.au)), then click on the link to "the facts", then find the link to "awards and scholarships" and start looking.

## **Strategy Five: Centrelink**

Centrelink have a range of means tested Scholarships, including the Relocation and Student Start Up Scholarships. The scholarships are offered to all university students receiving income support. The rules on these scholarships keep changing. A person from Centrelink will come in to talk to Yr 12 about this on 26 July and they will be at the Expo
