Congratulations to our School Captain Ben Williams, who was named Taree's Young Citizen of the Year at the Australia Day Ceremony held last month.

Welcome to the first newsletter of 2017! I'll start by acknowledging that our school is built on land that has seen continuous human habitation for over 40,000 years and I acknowledge the traditional custodians of this country, the Biripi nation and pay my respects to their elders both past and present. I also acknowledge my Aboriginal colleagues who work tirelessly to ensure ALL students at Chatham High School are fully prepared as the future leaders of our community.

At the conclusion of 2016 I was left with a real sense of optimism about the prospects for this year and our start has done nothing to alter that opinion. Our staff development day this year focussed on how adopting a strengths based approach to our interactions can lead to more positive outcomes for both students and colleagues. Based on a solid research footing, the strengths based approach assists people in recognising the innate capabilities we all possess and the concept we can all grow, regardless of what we may consider to be barriers. The acronym H.O.P.E. - Helping Other Possibilities Emerge, underpins much of this approach. The manner in which ALL our staff, from front office to teachers and paraprofessionals, approached this learning demonstrated to me the commitment we all have to ensure every student exits Chatham not only a stronger learner but a healthier, happier person.

We understand of course that the growth of our students is a journey families are most in connection with and without the combined effort of school and family a student will always be working at half throttle. There are plenty of ways that families can further support their students and joining either the AECG or P&C is a great way of providing input into how our school can best serve its community. Can I encourage you to overlook the best efforts of some teens when they try to lock you out of what's happening at school and ensure you stay in touch with our staff to make sure you have the full picture of your students' progress.

The continued hot weather may have played a part in reduced student numbers at the swimming carnival, for those students who were there though, the participation rate and general behaviour was outstanding! A number of students did feel the heat a little too much and it is timely to remind students to increase their water intake during periods of hot weather. Thanks to the generous fundraising of Year 12 2016, we have two chilled and filtered water coolers installed in the playgrounds for students to fill bottles or take a sip.

Can I remind families that supervision for students at school is only provided between the hours 8:30am and 3:45pm, or the departure of the last bus. Students are not to be on site outside these times unless at a scheduled event.

It was fabulous to see the smiling faces come through the gates this week, full of stories from the holidays and excited, yes EXCITED to be back here and that was just the staff! Honestly though, our first days back have been a positive experience for everyone and I look forward to many more to come. One particularly pleasing part of our first week back has been the number of students wearing the school uniform.

Whether you choose to call it pride or commitment, wearing a uniform allows us to consider our common goals; safe, respectful and responsible learners.

As you will read later in this newsletter and as many will know, Mr Merv Presland has indicated his intention to retire during this term. As such there are many 'lasts' for him to celebrate and we will make sure we send him off in a manner that recognises his commitment to public education. Till then, soak up these last days Mr Presland.

So many students, so many parents, so many colleagues, so many memories...

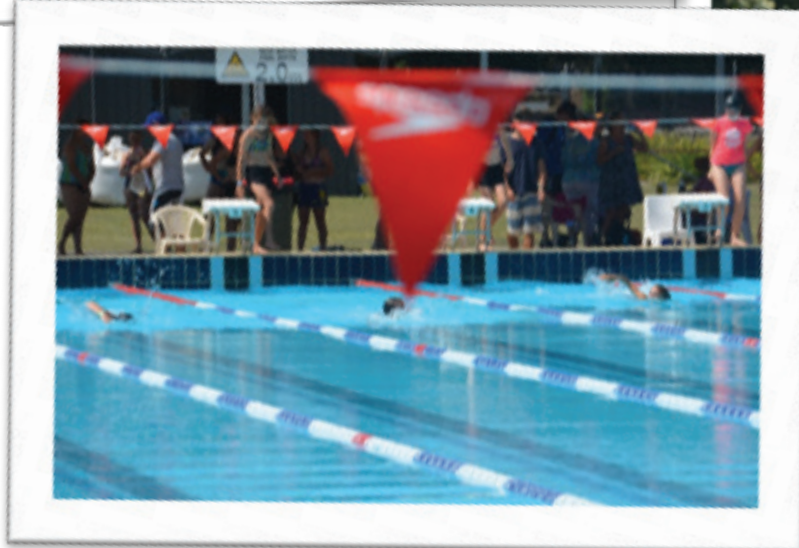
Leaving will be tinged with sadness, but, just as it is for a student finishing Year 12, the sadness is accompanied by the excitement of launching into a new world with new opportunities.

## Help for Year 7

The ABC's Heywire competition was something I had known about for years. It's all about connecting with youth from regional areas across Australia. They are asked to tell their story about what life's like in their area. I had regularly mentioned it to many students over the years, but when I mentioned it to Daroo, he said, "Sure, let's give it go!" We looked up all the details and

talked about some topics. He was keen, although, as always, kept his ever so 'cool' nature!

And here we are, as Daroo is about to embark on that next stage of his Heywire journey. He leaves for Canberra early on Saturday 4th February. The ABC all expenses paid trip includes accommodation at the Australian Institute of Sport, workshops with other regional Heywire winners and a visit to Parliament. At parliament, the youth will be presenting their ideas on how to improve opportunities for people in regional Australia, called the 'Heywire Ideas Launch' from 11am on Thursday 9th February.

### What is Student Assistance

Student Assistance funding is available from the school to help low income families with some of the schooling expenses for their children.

### Who can apply for Student Assistance

Any parent or carer who has a real need of financial help to pay for a child's school expenses may apply.

### Expenses you can apply for

You can apply for assistance to pay for Subject Contributions, books, school uniform items and equipment such as calculators. We are not permitted to use the funds for the General School Contribution. We are not permitted to give you back money you have already spent on school expenses.

### How to apply

Fill out the application form on the other side of this sheet. Please be exact with the information you provide.

You need to put in a separate form for each child and be clear about their Year or Support Class.

### How funds are allocated

Applications are considered and funds allocated by a committee who look at the merits of each application. Funds are limited so the committee will endeavour to provide something for all applicants.

Applications to the Student Assistance Scheme are invited each year.

If you received money last year, you are not automatically allocated money again this year. You need to apply again. All applications are strictly confidential.
