A big thanks to the community of Chatham High who have been patient and supportive as we have worked through the last few turbulent months. Allow me also to extend a thanks to the staff who have responded with integrity and grit and have kept up an inspiring pace to ensure EVERY student has their learning needs met and won't miss a step on their educational journey.

The pace is not likely to slacken in term three and there are a number of exciting events, health advice allowing, that we hope will continue our positive trend in troubling times. I hope students and families keep safe and well through the break and I look forward to seeing what adventures we get up to next term.
